



HISTORY

Jan 1, 2004 – VISA: all newly purchased attended POS PEDs must be VISA approved pre-PCI and support TDES.

July 1, 2005 - Interac: newly deployed POS terminals must be certified via Device Certification Program.

Oct 1, 2007 – VISA: newly deployed unattended POS PIN pads must have PCI-lab tested & VISA approved EPPs; and if used for offline PIN, must have lab validated & VISA approved secure smart card reader.

Dec 31, 2007 – Interac: certification program for non-CHIP POS terminals now closed

Jan 1, 2008 – Interac: purchasing of non-EMV capable terminals no longer allowed

Oct 1, 2008 – VISA: merchants accepting VISA cards for the first time must use only PA-DSS certified POS applications

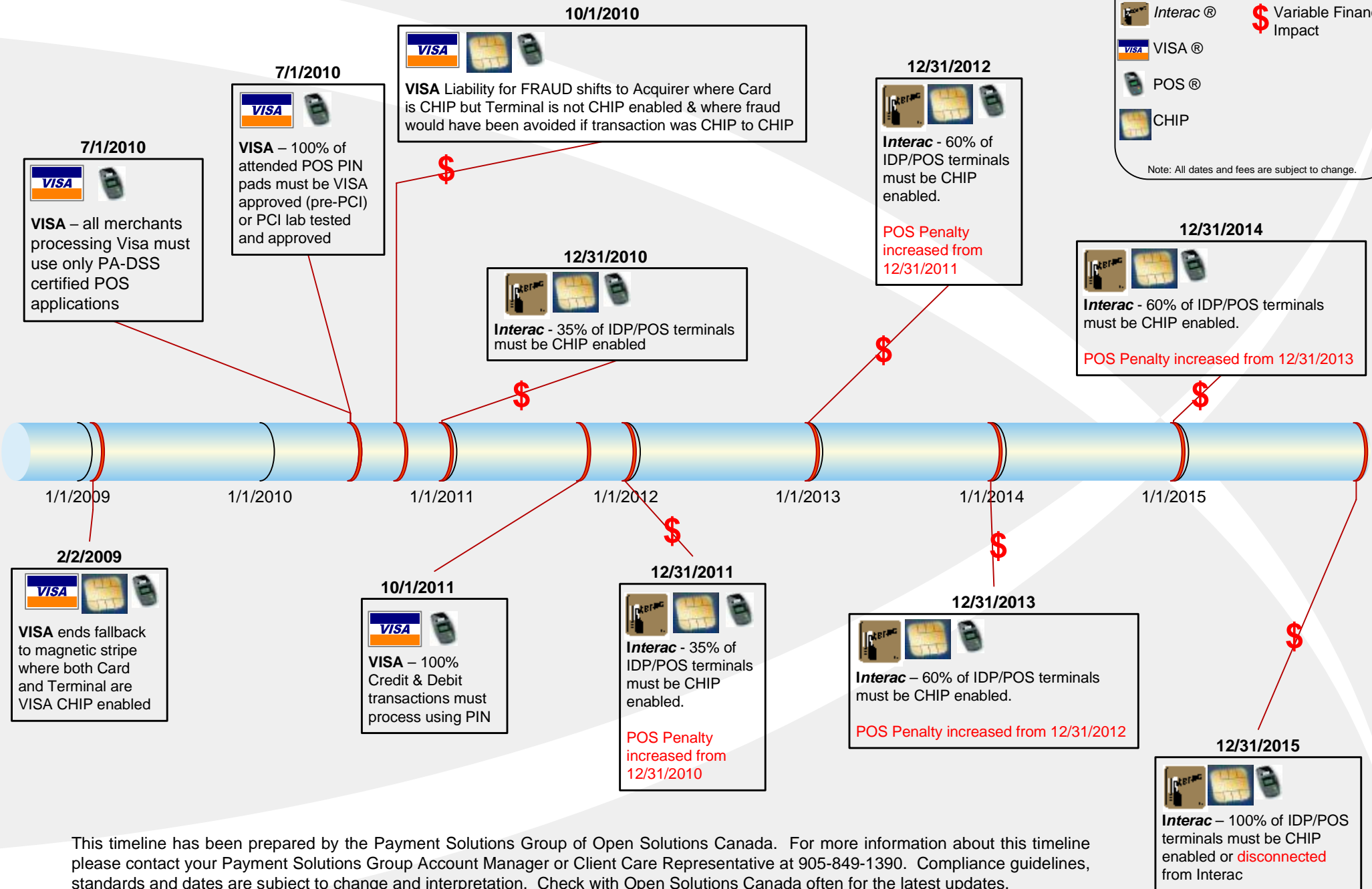
Canadian POS Industry Compliance Timeline
